Vitality Women's FA Cup Second Round

The return of competitive football following a four month absence saw Cheltenham make the journey to the coast to face Portsmouth Women.

The two sides battled out a draw in the 90 minutes, with both side having chances to break the deadlock in what was turning into a classic, sharply-contested cup affair.

There wasn't much to separate to the two sides before Robyn Levett came off worse following a collision with a Portsmouth player. She continued on but was forced off just after the start of extra time, collapsing in pain following a goal kick, presenting Molly Ripley with her debut from the bench.

Pompey's opener was something of a talking point in the game. After parrying a Portsmouth shot away for a corner, Ripley was beaten directly from Bradley's delivery as the cross evaded everyone before hitting the far post and nestling in the net.

There was nothing the young 'keeper could do about Pompey's second as Bath struck a lightning bolt of a shot after being given time and space inside the box just five minutes later.

Cheltenham would be the team to progress to the third round however, following an administrative error from Portsmouth saw them removed from the competition.

In a fixture streamed to over 3000 viewers, Cheltenham Town Ladies took to the field with a dream clash against Arsenal hanging in the balance.

With the fixture starting at a typical fast cup pace the teams exchanged chances early on, with captain Mai Butler being called on to stop an early shot threat, before, at the other end, Charlotte Criddle headed against the post from a Haynes' corner.

With the game deadlocked at the break, the second half would provide traditional cup drama. After 66 minutes it would be Cheltenham who struck first, with Butler keeping the ball in play allowing Haynes to cross. Bevan's presence in the box forced a mistake from a Gillingham defender who turned the ball into her own net.

After this the visitors turned the screw and asked questions of the Cheltenham defence. After absorbing an attack, Gillingham levelled the scores with a Keogh shot looping just over the outstretched hand of Ripley on her full debut.

Both sides fought valiantly into extra time, exchanging possession a little easier as the legs grew tired. A looping Cheltenham shot nestled on top of the Gillingham net to give the visitors a scare shortly before a low Otesha Charles finish from just inside the box broke Cheltenham hearts.
