Cheltenham Town Ladies fell to an opening-day defeat against Southampton Women in the club's first game at their new home in Cirencester.

Two Sian Wylie goals in a matter of minutes had given the visitors a half-time lead that reflected the pattern of play, but the Robins came back firing after the break.

They came close on several occasions, before a fortuitous third goal for Southampton knocked the stuffing out of Cheltenham. However, Lacy-Jai Liggett did get one back in the last ten minutes to give the team some positives to take away from the performance.

It was a new-look starting 11 selected by Tom Davies, with Amy Wathan, Monet Legall, Lois Colley and Aimee Watson among the debutants.

The game at the Corinium Stadium began with Southampton on the front foot, and Rachel Okoro and Hannah Samuels both came close.

The visitors continued to enjoy more of the ball, and took the lead when Emily Wernham drove towards the byline, pulled the ball back, and after her initial effort was blocked, Wylie found the net at the second time of asking. The shot had just enough power on it after more valiant defending.

Just a couple of minutes later, Wylie found the net again as Samuels got down the left and put in a low cross that was confidently finished by the striker. Cheltenham started to get a foothold in the game after Aliss Wheeler was denied a third by the offside flag, but they suffered another blow just before half-time as new signing Legall had to be substituted.

It was nearly the perfect end to the half for Davies' side, but Billie Haynes' (pictured) expert turn and shot came off the post to ensure the two-goal deficit remained at half-time. Another unfortunate moment for the hosts saw Lois Colley pull up on the edge of her own box, leading to a one-on-one chance for Rachel Okoro, but the Southampton player missed the target.

Once again, the Robins responded well to adversity as Haynes played in substitute Holly Rogers, whose shot was well-saved by Ellie Parker.

After a teasing ball into the box went all the way through, Southampton went up the other end and scored a third as the rebound from Wylie's effort was cleared straight into Emily Wernham and it bounced into the net. Cheltenham had a couple more efforts through Liggett and found their goal on 85 minutes as Rogers played an excellent through ball for the former rugby player, who finished well past Parker.

The Robins ended the game well, threatening to get another back, but a couple of stoppages in the final moments halted their momentum.

## MATCH REPORT

A 4-0 win away on the south coast sealed Cheltenham Town Ladies' first victory of the season on Sunday.

A dominant performance with goals from Amy Wathan, Billie Haynes, Abby Bevan and debut goal for Georgie-Marie Barbour-Gresham enough for all three points.

The Robins created considerably more chances than their hosts and barring a couple of Poole chances at the end of the first half, the result never looked in doubt.

Cheltenham now sit fifth in the Women's National League Division One South West after the first two rounds of fixtures.

Manager Tom Davies made three changes to the side that were beaten by Southampton Women on opening day. Barbour-Gresham and Angelina Goodwin made their competitive debuts, while Holly Rogers started for the first time since returning from injury. The trio replaced Ellie Walecki, Monet Legall and Lois Colley from the first game, with Tamzin Hayward earning a place on the bench.

Cheltenham came close to a very early opener as Haynes' corner came off the bar, before Charlotte Criddle set up Rogers with a couple of excellent through balls, both of which were saved by Sam Chrippes.

Rogers again almost found the breakthrough as she had an effort cleared off the line, with Lacy-Jai Liggett and Bevan also going close in the early stages.

The goal came on 22 minutes, and in some style, as new signing Wathan took aim from all of 25 yards and found the net effortlessly.

Liggett and Haynes then tested the Poole 'keeper as the Robins looked for some breathing space.

Poole almost got back on level terms just before the interval with a speculative strike from distance catching the post, and Aimee Watson being forced into action for the first time a couple of minutes later.

Despite trailing at the break, Poole continued their momentum at the start of the second half, with a shot from a narrow angle hitting the side netting. However, the energetic Haynes doubled Cheltenham's lead on 53 minutes, driving into the area and firing across the goal from 12 yards out.

Rogers then did well to create an opening on 61 minutes, but her shot went over. The third goal came soon enough, though, when Bevan elegantly lobbed Chrippes from the edge of the area.

Liggett forced another save, before Wathan was denied from close range as the clock ticked over 90 minutes. In added time, Cheltenham found a fourth as Barbour-Gresham got on the end of Haynes' corner and headed into the net expertly.
