Lacy-Jai Liggett says there's a feel-good factor around the Cheltenham Town Ladies squad at the moment as the Robins continue their excellent season in both league and cup.

Tom Davies' side are now unbeaten in seven games in all competitions, and Liggett has played a key part in that run.

Despite being new to the squad, she has already notched seven goals to sit as the club's outright top goal scorer and netted twice in the team's last outing against Downend Flyers.

She said: "There's a very good morale around the squad at the moment, it feels like everyone is keeping each other on their toes, so we can keep pushing for the league and pushing for the cup."

"I give everything on the pitch, which is known by the girls in my fiery attitude, but that is because I am a winner, and I don't like to lose. I'm happy to be top goal scorer at this stage"

In a rearranged game following extremely poor weather leaving Petersfield Park unplayable, Cheltenham Town Ladies took out their frustrations on their visitors in a seven-goal thriller which saw two hattricks.

With a tense start and both teams playing at pace, there were some silky passing skills on display, with the visitors getting out of the blocks strongly early on. Fortunately for Cheltenham, the Grecians were unable to find the clinical pass in the final third.

Cheltenham's pressing game generated a few mistakes at the back from Exeter, with Kerry Bartlett getting a foot to a loose ball, allowing for Abby Bevan to lash a shot with frightening accuracy from 25 yards to open the scoring.

Exeter would respond in kind, demanding perfection from Cheltenham's defence before captain, Annie Martin, would pick up the ball on the left wing before dancing her way into the box past three Grecians defenders before hammering the ball just inside the near post.

Exeter would start the second half much as they had the first and pounded on the Cheltenham door, eventually forcing an opening which saw Britton stab the ball past Panniers in the midst of a goalmouth scramble.

The visitors kept their foot on the peddle and asked more questions of Cheltenham's defensive organisation and it eventually paid off. A poor clearance by the home side saw Exeter deliver another cross into the danger zone for Britton to nod in for her second.

Within minutes, Martin would bag a second of her and restore Cheltenham's two goal lead with a fantastic strike after Bevan and Bartlett combined to carve open the visiting defence.

As proceedings remained tense, Martin would close out her star performance, completing her hattrick after a low, driven diagonal ball was set up by Hitchcox. Martin was given enough time to turn and shoot, her hard low drive evading the Exeter 'keeper.

Refusing to stay down as the clock hit 90 minutes, Exeter made sure nobody was leaving with any finger nails in tact as Britton popped up in space in the Cheltenham box, and slotted past Panniers with a sublime finish low to her left.

With the pace of the game picking up quickly as the sides exchanged attacks, with Billie Haynes active on the Cheltenham left. After holding out against a barrage of visiting attacks, Exeter would go on a spell of their own in a reversal of the roles. Cheltenham this time, would stand strong in defence.

Haynes, a thorn in the Exeter side early on would open the scoring. The acting-wingback latched onto a perfectly weighted pass from striker Jade Grove and raced away before tucking her shot around the onrushing goalkeeper.

In the following exchanges, Exeter tested Levett at every opportunity, peppering the visiting goal with shots in and around the box but were unable to find a way through. Cheltenham's defence would remain organised and maintain their lead going into the break.

The second half started in similar fashion to how the first ended, with Exeter asking questions.

With the tension rising as the clock ticked away, Exeter looked to overload the Cheltenham defence and it paid off, winning a penalty as the clock went red. Despite a hand from Levett, Exeter's Britton found the net to level the scores.

Cheltenham would respond immediately, with Bevan putting the ball in the net but an offside flag stopped the celebrations.

The teams would remain level through 120 minutes and it was down to penalties to separate the teams. Criddle, Haynes and Bevan's successful penalties were equalled by Britton, Suominen and Toogood before Levett would stop Baker's spot kick

before Halford slotted her shot home. Exeter's final taker Kaptein stepped up but saw her shot rattle the crossbar to a chorus of Cheltenham fan's celebrations.
