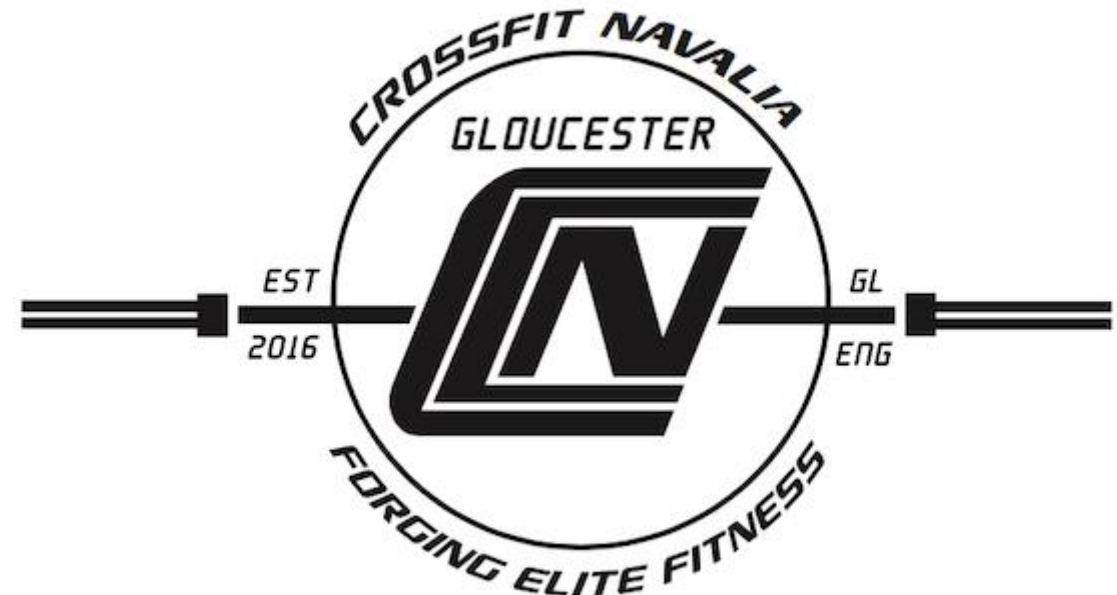

Cheltenham scored four second half goals to see off Maidenhead to register their fifth game unbeaten in the FA WNL Division One SW.

After a competitive but goalless first half, Lacy-Jai Liggett gave The Robinesses their opener.

Tina Brett would equalise for Maidenehad shortly after, but further goals from Georgie-Marie Barbour-Gresham, Mai Butler and another for Liggett would hand Cheltenham the three points.

The action started cautiously with both sides feeling each other out, creating chances but not really threatening on goal.

Liggett opened the first chance, taking the ball around the 'keeper but failing to finish due to losing balance.

Amy Wathan then fired wide from inside

the box a couple of minutes later in what was the last meaningful attack by either side in the first half.

Whatever was said at half time clearly worked as Cheltenham flew out of the blocks, causing real issues as Wathan headed wide from a Lois Colley free-kick.

Minutes later Liggett would open the scoring, with a smart finish across the face of goal after a driving run.

Maidenhead reacted well, with some good play resulting in a free-kick on the edge of the Cheltenham box.

The shot took a wicked deflection, wrong footing Watson and finding the corner of the net.

As Cheltenham rallied, Barbour-Gresham would rise highest in the penalty box, steering Holly Reed's corner into the net from close range.

Sammy Hallsworth would enter the fray, replacing Colley, but would find herself heading out of the game only minutes later after being sent to the sin-bin for dissent.

This wouldn't have too much impact however, as captain Butler would pop up with a delightful finish from a Charlotte Criddle cross.

Liggett would continue hunting her third brace of the season and would be rewarded for her efforts. Her hard work would see her head the ball away from the onrushing Maidenhead goalkeeper and tapping in with ease to round off a thorough performance.
