It doesn't seem anything like eight months since our blistering start to our second season at the Lane, the 4-0 drubbing of Plymouth. We have certainly enjoyed year two here, and we hope you have too.

A year that has seen us reach two cup finals and go deeper in the Adobe Women's FA Cup than we ever have before, both testament to the group of players and staff that we have.







Cheltenham Town Women suffered a narrow defeat on the road to promotion-hopefuls Exeter City last weekend.

The Grecians took the lead through a long-range curling effort from Amber Pollock. Doris Greenwood pulled The Robinesses level after a superb start to the second half from the visitors, but Exeter scored again just after the hour mark to take all three points.

Tom Davies declined to make any changes and fielded the same team that had beaten AFC Wimbledon the previous weekend, as Cheltenham took to the field at St. James Park.

Cheltenham threatened the home side early on, with Greenwood almost breaking away on the counter-attack multiple times, as well as a Lilly Wellesley-Davies' header from a corner going just wide of Abbi Bond's goal.

However, it was the home side that took the lead after 27 minutes, after Amber Pollock's effort curled into Mia Smith's goal.

Cheltenham's fightback began immediately, as Greenwood went close to equalising, cutting inside well but her effort went just over the crossbar.

The half-time break would come with both sides cancelling each other out, with Pollock's goal being the only divider.

Whatever was said in the Cheltenham dressing room during half-time clearly had an impact. The Robinesses started the second half brilliantly, with Greenwood scoring just three minutes into the half.

After the visitors defended an Exeter corner, Libby Bell did well to win the ball back as the hosts looked to recycle possession into another attack,

and after playing a sleek one-two with Una Lue, won a throw-in down the right.

Bell took the throw quickly to allow Lue to run onto it and the young striker's first touch was a perfect through-ball into the path of Greenwood, who got to the ball before Emily Toogood and rounded the onrushing Bond to slot the ball home into an empty net for her fifth of the season.

The Robinesses kept the pressure on the home side, but the Grecians retook the lead in the 62nd minute through Maya Kendell.

Lue had a great chance to draw Cheltenham level after a corner fell to her, but her shot from close range was blocked.

Deep into stoppage time, Cheltenham had more chances with free-kicks and corners, but Exeter's defence held strong to hold on to the three points.
