Firstly, I'd like to welcome all the youth teams who are here with us today after playing their matches earlier on.

PREVIOUS OUTING:

Oxford United come into this clash on the back of a 1-1 draw against AFC Wimbledon. The U's went 1-0 up in the second half, but just three minutes later, were pegged back 1-1.

Adele Lindbaek scored early in the second half to give her side a one-goal advantage, however, Hannah Mackenzie's header, which came just three minutes later, levelled the game.

Despite some late pressure from the hosts, the score line remained level.

They opened their league account with a

1-0 win over Gwalia United away from home, meaning Sam Rose's side come into this clash sat in fourth place, on four points.

Holly Manders

Midfielder Holly Manders will be one to watch this afternoon for the visitors, starting all three games this season for the U's so far, and providing one goal and one assist.

She joined Oxford in the summer after leaving
Nottingham Forest, where she won both the league
and cup double last season. After winning promotion
to the WSL2 last campaign, she'll be looking to do the
same, this time with Oxford United.

IN THE DUGOUT: SAM ROSE

Opposition manager Sam Rose has been with Oxford United since late 2023, and is Oxford's first and only full-time women's manager.

Rose is no stranger to the women's game, and joined the U's from WSL side Aston Villa, where he worked as the assistant manager. Last season, he picked up the Manager of the month award for February, after an unbeaten month.

After guiding his side to two consecutive fifth-placed finishes, he'll be looking for a top-end finish this season.

Rose also brings a wealth of experience in youth football, working with the likes of Burton Albion and Nottingham Forest, where he worked in multiple different roles across a 12-year period.



Last Season vs Cheltenham:

Cheltenham faced the U's twice last season in the league, and proved to be a tough test for the Robinesses.

Our first meeting came last October, at Court Place Farm, which saw the hosts take all three points Despite the game begining even early on, the U's took the lead in the first half through Zoe Barratt

Chances fell Cheltenham's way but Barratt was on hand to score a second. Kate
Wiseman put the game to bed with a third in injury time

A clash in February at Kayte Lane proved to be a more even encounter.

Libby Bell gave the Robinesses an early lead within the opening 10 minutes, however, two goals just before half time for the visitors were enough to come away with all three points

Cheltenham Town Women pick up their first three points on the road in a 4-1 win over Real Bedford.

Goals from Bella Hall, Amelie Curtis, Libby Bell and Louise Guymira meant the Robinesses came away with all three points.

Cheltenham almost had the perfect start through Charlotte Salisbury-Williams, who hit the bar from long-range within the opening few minutes.

Hall opened her Cheltenham account on the 11thminute mark, chesting the ball down before finishing well past Real Bedford keeper Erica Meale.



Curtis doubled the lead within the next two minutes, her effort nestling into the bottom lefthand corner to put the Robinesses 2-0 up early on.

Real Bedford had chances to half the deficit, Breon Grant denied by keeper Ella Stowell at her near post, before Grant's effort two-minutes later fell wide of the target.

Cheltenham took a strong 2-0 lead in with them at the break.

Issy Bryant had the first shot of the second half, but it was easy for keeper Stowell.

Bell got the Robinesses third despite an onslaught of pressure from the hosts, lobbing keeper Meale from outside the box.

Substitute Lucy Wood did get one back for the hosts just after the 70-minute mark, meaning a nervy end to the game for Cheltenham.

However, Guymira scored the Robinesses fourth, spinning her defender before slotting home. That goal ended all hopes of Real Bedford comeback, and the game finished 4-1 to the visitors as we pick up our first three points of the season.

LAST WEEK'S 4-1 VICTORY OVER REAL BEDFORD MARKED 100 APPEARANCES FOR OUR CAPTAIN, HAVING JOINED THE CLUB IN 2022.

Em, congratulations on 100 appearances for the club. How does it feel to have hit that landmark?

heartwarming.

Looking at the start of this season, with wins against Real Bedford and Worcester after the opening day defeat, what do you think is possible for you and the rest of the team?

For me personally, it would be adding more appearances under my belt and leading the team to more cup finals this year. As a club, it's very much the same targets, being finishing top 4 and reaching cup finals.


